Position Description

The Indigenous Trainee will be employed in a role that supports all of the staff and projects currently being undertaken at the Gomeroi gaaynggal Centre. This includes but is not limited to, research studies through recruitment, sample collections and administration support, Artshealth programs including participating in art and health programs and providing support to Indigenous Artist. The trainee will be required to complete a traineeship in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Primary Health Care in addition to undertaking blood collection training.

Essential Criteria

- Provision Drivers Licence (minimum)
- Knowledge of local Indigenous Community with demonstrated community connections.
- Highly developed interpersonal skills including the ability to participate in a team environment demonstrating clear communication and mutual respect within the workplace and within community.
- Willingness to undertake further training relevant to the workplace including completion of ATSI Primary Health Care traineeship & Blood collecting.
- Ability and willingness to travel outside Tamworth area.
- Ability and willingness to work flexible hours including afterhours and weekends if required.
- Capacity to adhere to workplace policies and procedures in the areas of Work Health and Safety, Equity, Diversity and promoting a respectful workplace culture.

Desirable Criteria

- Demonstrated ability to perform tasks in a timely manner and attend work with punctuality.
- Maintain confidentiality.
- Provide own transportation to and from work.
